SkillsUSA WYOMING CHAMPIONSHIPS

The SkillsUSA Championships provides an opportunity for members to prove their industry-readiness by testing their skills and ability to standards set and assessed by industry partners. These competitive events begin at the local level and allow students to advance to state, and national levels for recognition. Through the SkillsUSA Championships, members are able to connect with professionals within the field and develop relationships for future employment and success.



As an integral part of curriculum, the industry-validated SkillsUSA Championships provide students with workplace experiences in 14 career clusters. Industry partners establish entry level competencies to measure proficiency in technical and employability skill development resulting in the technical standards for each competition. Partners evaluate the authentic assessments that create the competitions. Through the Championships members are able to connect with professionals in the field to develop relationships for future employment success.

2021 STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS PLAN

As an organization, SkillsUSA Wyoming focuses on fulfilling the organization's mission while ensuring long-term success. In the 25 year history of SkillsUSA Wyoming, last year brought the first cancellation of the State Leadership and Skills Conference. To ensure future success of SkillsUSA Wyoming and continue to provide members the incredible opportunity to showcase their skills in front of business and industry partners across the country, SkillsUSA Wyoming is committed to hosting our flagship program, the SkillsUSA Wyoming Championships this year.

SkillsUSA Wyoming's number one priority for all of our decisions has and will always be the safety and well-being of our students, teachers, and volunteers.

SkillsUSA Wyoming has collaborated with advisors, career and technical education directors and other organizations, as well as reviewed safety and health guidelines set by the Wyoming Department of Public Heath and the Wyoming Department of Education. Through this process, SkillsUSA Wyoming has committed to hosting the State Championships following two guiding principles:

With restrictions created in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, SkillsUSA Wyoming believes it will be possible to meet in person for events this year. This year's State Leadership and Skills Conference will be held in-person, April 15-17, 2021 at Casper College in Casper Wyoming.

The State Leadership and Skills Conference and State Championships is the pinnacle SkillsUSA Wyoming program allowing student to showcase their skill development around the essential elements of the SkillsUSA Framework. During the event, members will become aware, demonstrate and highlight their mastery around six essential elements:

These essential elements will be realized during pre-work, event activities as well as post-event through programming that includes SkillsUSA Championships contests, training experiences, as well as special events. This event will also celebrate SkillsUSA Framework skill development though honoring Chapters of Excellence as well as students who have earned SkillsUSA Career Essentials credentials. Displaying these skill sets allow students to showcase technical skills, connect students to employers, as well as develop employability skills that are validated by our business partners. The language around the SkillsUSA Framework allows members to articulate to employers their skills and how their time in SkillsUSA benefits employers.

CONTEST DELIVERY FORMAT

SkillsUSA Wyoming will offer 47 career competition contests in nine career clusters this year. Additionally through business and industry need and support, two new contests will be demonstrated this year. Delivery will look the same as in year's past. The overall conference will be more controlled in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

SAFETY PROTOCOL

We have implemented stringent safety protocols for all attendees: Masks are required at all times, social distancing will be enforced, frequent cleanings of competition space, decreased event capacity, and health screening and temperature scan upon entering Casper College facilities. No walk-in spectators will be allowed.

FLUID COOPERATION

We are hopeful that the health of our nation will improve. We must also remain realistic. Circumstances beyond our control may suspend this conference. IF the unforeseen happens, we as an association, will have few options for sending Wyoming representation to the Virtual National Conference. Your patience and cooperation are appreciated.

STATE LEADERSHIP & SKILLS CONFERENCE

The 26th SkillsUSA Wyoming State Leadership & Skills Conference will be held April 15-17, 2021. The conference will kick off on April 15 on the Campus of Casper College in Casper, Wyoming. Advisor/Chapter check-in will take place at specific staggered times to allow for social distancing. April 15 will be the start of leadership and skilled competitions. There will be no opening ceremony or social event or Techspo. No meals will be provided to prevent large gatherings in confined spaces. Our registration fee reflects this change.



On Saturday, April 17th, 2021 we will celebrate the work of our members and chapters with an Awards Ceremony. Here, the gold, silver and bronze medalist of each contest will be recognized and announced. The top competitor in each contest will have the opportunity to represent Wyoming at the Virtual National Leadership and Skills Conference. If COVID-19 protocol prohibits a closing ceremony, it will be presented, virtually.
