- Calendar and prepare for online Professional Development Test and online Technical Assessments - Testing Window April 6-11

Registration

ELIGIBILITY

Only SkillsUSA Wyoming registered members whose chapter has achieved **Quality Chapter** status through the Chapter Excellence Program **are eligible to attend**. Administrators, chaperones, and other school personnel are also eligible to attend. ALL ATTENDEES, including students, advisors, and school personnel attending the conference, are REQUIRED to register.

Conference Policies

By registering, you agree to all conference policies and guidelines outlined in this conference guide.

COMPETITION REGISTRATION POLICY

At State Leadership and Skills Conference, a student can:

- Compete in ONE Leadership Contest,
- Compete in ONE skilled/occupational competition,
- Compete in ONE TEAM EVENT (Quiz Bowl, Health Knowledge Bowl, any skilled/occupational OR leadership event requiring more than one person).

Note: Recall that as of 2025, competitions held in Gillette, at Gillette College, are NO LONGER exceptions.

CANCELLATION POLICY

Cancellations are not permitted after the registration deadline, and no refunds will be issued, even if schools or attendees cannot participate. To facilitate smooth planning for the state conference, please notify us of any registered contestants who will no longer attend so they can be dropped. Your cooperation is vital to ensuring an efficient and successful event.

SUBSTITUTION POLICY

Substitutions for competitors will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

Please contact the state office.

The guidelines for accepting a substitution include:

- Required to be a registered SkillsUSA member by February 1.

HOUSING POLICIES

General Housing Policy

Chapters attending the conference are responsible for selecting and booking their lodging in Casper, including the option to stay at the headquarters hotel. Regardless of the chosen accommodations, all chapters must adhere to the policies and rules set by their respective hotels. Chapters need to ensure their behavior aligns with hotel guidelines to maintain a positive relationship with local establishments and uphold the reputation of SkillsUSA Wyoming.

DRESS CODE POLICIES

SkillsUSA official attire is defined as:

- Official SkillsUSA red blazer or official SkillsUSA red jacket, SkillsUSA black Carhartt jacket
- Button-up, collared, white dress shirt (accompanied by a plain, solid black tie or SkillsUSA black tie), white shirt (collarless or small-collared) or white turtleneck, with any collar not to extend into the lapel area of the blazer, sweater, windbreaker or jacket
- Black dress slacks or black dress skirt (knee-length at minimum)
- Black closed-toe dress shoes

Competition Clothing Dress Code

This can be found in the competition's [National Technical Standards](#). Clothing **classifications** can be found in the [SkillsUSA Clothing Classifications](#).

Wyoming has made the following clothing modifications to the Clothing Classifications:

- **Class A WY modification:** *Jackets can be checked out at registration. Quantities are limited, and they must be returned by the Closing Ceremony on Wednesday.*
- **Class B WY modification:** *Unofficial Scrubs acceptable. White or black athletic-style canvas or mesh shoes ARE acceptable.*
- **Class C WY modification:** *Jeans, tucked shirt, leather work shoes/boots - no tennis shoes, and abide by all safety requirements in the National Technical Standards or State of Wyoming Updates.*
- **Class D WY modification:** *Jeans, tucked shirt, leather work shoes/boots - no tennis shoes and abide by all safety requirements in the National Technical Standards or State of Wyoming Updates.*
- **Classes E, F WY modification:** *Unofficial white polo/oxford/blouse is acceptable.*
- **Class G WY modification:** *Refer to information found in the Wyoming Updates.*
- **Class H WY modification:** *Unofficial white long-sleeved dress shirt acceptable.*
- **Class I WY modification:** *Refer to information found in the Wyoming Updates.*
- **Quiz Bowl:** *White shirt/blouse or conference shirt, or team shirt. Black pants/skirt and black shoes. (No jacket or tie required)*

ALWAYS revert to the National Technical Standards requirements when preparing for the National Leadership and Skills Conference in Atlanta, Georgia.

Champions After Party Dress Code

School-appropriate casual attire is required.

Voting Delegate Dress Code

Voting Delegates should wear SkillsUSA official attire to the delegate session.

SkillsUSA official attire is defined as:

- Red SkillsUSA blazer, windbreaker, or sweater, or black or red SkillsUSA jacket

- Button-up, collared, white dress shirt (accompanied by a plain, solid black tie), white blouse (collarless or small-collared) or white turtleneck, with any collar not to extend into the lapel area of the blazer, sweater, windbreaker, or jacket
- Black dress slacks or black dress skirt (**knee-length**).
- Black dress shoes – NOT black tennis shoes or black cowboy boots.

Note: The official SkillsUSA windbreaker, sweater, and black Carhartt jacket are no longer available for purchase in the SkillsUSA Store. However, these clothing items are grandfathered in as previous official SkillsUSA clothing and can be worn in SkillsUSA competitions as directed in this document.

Note: Wearing socks or hose is not required. If worn, socks must be black dress socks and hose must be either black or skin-tone and seamless/non-pattern.

Awards Ceremony Dress Code

Professional attire is required for all other attendees not defined as a contestant. Contestants must be in SkillsUSA official attire or SkillsUSA **national** competition attire (*Wyoming dress code modifications do not meet this criterion*) to be permitted on stage to accept their medallion.

SkillsUSA official attire is defined as:

- Red SkillsUSA blazer, windbreaker, or sweater, or black or red SkillsUSA jacket
- Button-up, collared, white dress shirt (accompanied by a plain, solid black tie), white blouse (collarless or small-collared) or white turtleneck, with any collar not to extend into the lapel area of the blazer, sweater, windbreaker, or jacket
- Black dress slacks or black dress skirt (**knee-length**).
- Black dress shoes – NOT black tennis shoes or black cowboy boots.

Miniskirts, crop tops, black or blue jeans, ball caps – anything NOT listed above will not walk the stage at closing ceremonies. Police your students packing to avoid this uncomfortable conversation on the stage floor.

Note: The official SkillsUSA windbreaker, sweater and black Carhartt jacket are no longer available for purchase in the SkillsUSA Store. However, these clothing items are grandfathered in as previous official SkillsUSA clothing and can be worn in SkillsUSA competitions as directed in this document.

Note: Wearing socks or hose is not required. If worn, socks must be black dress socks and hose must be either black or skin-tone and seamless/non-pattern.

AWARDS CEREMONY MEDALLION/PRIZES POLICY

Attendance is required at the Awards Ceremonies. SkillsUSA Wyoming holds the policy that no medallions or prizes will be mailed in the event of an absent winner at the Awards Ceremony. Please ensure your school has a representative present to accept medallions and/or prizes on stage at the Awards Ceremony. Only students will be allowed to go on stage to collect their medallion and/or prizes. This policy applies to all events where awards are given. No certificates, lapel pins, plaques, medallions, etc. will be mailed, delivered, or picked up.

AWARDS CEREMONY ATTENDANCE FOR NATIONAL ADVANCEMENT POLICY

Attendance is required at the Awards Ceremony. If first-place winners are absent, they will not advance to the National Leadership and Skills Conference. Please ensure your school has a representative present to accept medallions and/or prizes on stage at the Awards Ceremony. If there is an emergency or special circumstance, advisors should contact the State Office. Any requests submitted after the Awards Ceremony will not be considered.

Programming

CHAMPIONSHIPS

The SkillsUSA Championships is the premier showcase of Wyoming's most highly skilled middle school, high school, and postsecondary career and technical education students. It is one of the most impactful hands-on workforce development programs in the state. Held at SkillsUSA Wyoming's State Leadership and Skills Conference, this inspiring event features students competing head-to-head in 60+ skilled, occupational, and leadership competitions.

The philosophy of the SkillsUSA Championships is to reward students for excellence, involve industry professionals in directly evaluating student performance, and ensure that classroom training aligns with employers' needs. The competitions are developed, overseen, and judged by dedicated industry volunteers, all committed to building the next generation of skilled professionals, career-ready leaders, and responsible community members that our future depends on.

The SkillsUSA Championships is the culmination of a process that begins with students preparing and honing their skills through their SkillsUSA Wyoming chapters. Competitors advance directly to the state-level competitions, where they showcase their talents and test their abilities against the best in the state. State gold medalists then earn the opportunity to compete nationally at the National Leadership and Skills Conference held each June. Along with gold, silver, and bronze medallions, competitors may earn scholarships, tools of the trade, and even job offers. Most importantly, they gain the confidence that comes with knowing they are among the very best in their fields.

BOARD-APPROVED COMPETITION ELIGIBILITY

Each student may:

- Compete in ONE Leadership Contest,
- Compete in ONE skilled/occupational competition,
- Compete in ONE TEAM EVENT (Quiz Bowl, Health Knowledge Bowl, any skilled/occupational OR leadership event requiring more than one person).
- The exception is: Medical Terminology.

Note: Competitions held in Gillette, at Gillette College are NO LONGER exceptions.

The best way to configure this formula is to consider a student's top contest choices and THEN plug them into the rule and the schedule.

If a student wants to compete in Health Knowledge Bowl, Med Terminology, Medical Math, and Quiz Bowl, they can! Med Term, is the exception listed above, HKB - can serve to check one of two boxes - their team competition or their Occupational Competition. Med Term would check the Technical Competition box, and Quiz Bowl would check the leadership competition box. Again - what do they want to do, and then work the formula backwards to see if it works!

What must always be considered? Scheduling! MOST leadership contests are on Day One. Technical on Day Two. A student can not choose Individual welding (technical contest) and Welding Fabrication (team choice) because they happen on the same day. This type of scenario is indeed an exception to the rule we have in place, but in the case of most students, it does not create an issue as most are only enrolled in one career pathway and therefore only compete in one technical competition. For the reason of preparation alone, we highly recommend only one skilled/technical competition.

TECHSPO

At the Techspo, you will find hands-on displays that allow students to engage with industry leaders, equipment, and materials related to various Career and Technical Education pathways. Colleges and career tech institution representatives are also present and many provide scholarships in technical areas to gold medalists on Wednesday.

VOTING DELEGATES

SkillsUSA is a student-led organization, and one way we can ensure this is through the voting delegate program. Each local chapter shall be entitled to appoint or elect two voting delegates to represent their chapter.

Duties and Responsibilities

The duties of the voting delegates are important to the operation of the organization. Duties include:

- Represent the views of your chapter
- Attend the Voting Delegate Meeting to hear candidate speeches and participate in the election

VOTING DELEGATES *continued*:

Eligibility

Each Wyoming Chapter may send 2 delegates. All student members are eligible to serve as voting delegates. We discourage competitors from serving as voting delegates whose schedule hinders attending the delegate session on Monday evening. The election will not be moved to accommodate competitor schedules, so if the competitor is unable to participate in the election at the Voting Delegate Meeting, they will forfeit their vote.

CHAPTER EXCELLENCE PROGRAM

The Chapter Excellence Program (CEP) is the single best way to build a successful SkillsUSA chapter. The CEP recognizes achievement in integrating the SkillsUSA Framework into the chapter Program of Work activities.

Every chapter is required to participate in the CEP, and there are three award levels to recognize program involvement. The first two levels are acknowledged on a state level, and the third level is recognized nationally. Each level is designed to give chapters a benchmark for success and future improvement, leading to stronger chapters and better-prepared students. To compete at the State Leadership and Skills Conference, all chapters must achieve Quality Chapter status through the CEP. The more a chapter applies the SkillsUSA Framework, the greater the chance for CEP honors, so go for the gold and gain the recognition your chapter deserves through CEP participation!



Recognition Levels

Level 1: Quality Chapter

This first level honors chapters for achieving essential standards of excellence **and is a requirement in Wyoming to be eligible to register for state conference.**

Level 2: Chapter of Distinction

This second level recognizes chapters that go beyond baseline requirements, and Chapter of Distinction award winners may earn bronze, silver, or gold levels of this award. Chapters that achieve this level will be recognized at SkillsUSA Wyoming's State Leadership and Skills Conference.

Level 3: Models of Excellence

Chapters in each state receiving a gold "Chapter of Distinction" award are eligible for national selection as a Models of Excellence chapter. These chapters define excellence. Best practices will be gleaned from the award winners and shared with the field to serve as models for other chapters to emulate in strengthening their local programs. Eight chapters will be chosen to represent each component of the SkillsUSA Framework (Personal, Workplace, and Technical Skills), and one winner representing each component will be chosen at SkillsUSA's National Leadership and Skills Conference.
